○ Characteristics and history

Osaka University was officially founded as Japan's imperial university in 1931. Based on its open spirit, the university has established pioneering schools, graduate schools, and research institutes in both the sciences and liberal arts. Grounded on local community and through the university-industry-government collaboration, Osaka University has earned a worldwide reputation as a distinguished center of education and research. As a comprehensive research university with high research level in every field, the University is cultivating talented human resources who will act as active leaders in the advanced information society.

Osaka University has three campuses, which are located in Suita, Toyonaka and Minoh. Currently, approximately 23,300 students are studying and around 7,000 staffs are working.

◇ Outline and characteristics of the course for Teacher Training Students

○ Characteristics of the program

The Teacher Training Program is carried out at Minoh campus by the Graduate School of Humanities as a host department.

Students are offered special training at the Division of Japanese Studies, Graduate School of Humanities.

*On April 1, 2022, Osaka University will merge its Graduate School of Language and Culture and Graduate School of Letters into the Graduate School of Humanities

○ Outline of the course

- Japanese language education

Six-month intensive language training is offered at the CIEE. Students may audit the subjects related to Japanese Linguistics offered by the CJLC and School of Foreign Studies.

- Specialized training

Students should audit courses offered at the Graduate School of Humanities. Students can take courses with Japanese students as classmates.

- Others

Advising professors will give students academic advice to meet each student's needs. Students may join experience learning subjects related to Japanese culture offered by the CJLC.

◇ Follow-up for graduates

Students will have opportunities to participate in the academic meetings and symposia on Japanese language and culture organized by Osaka Univ.

○Monthly rent: 30,000 JPY to 70,000 JPY (average rent around the campuses)

○Security deposit ("Shiki-kin") and/or key money ("Rei-kin"): 0 JPY to 300,000 JPY (*) vary depending on apartments
