<p>My research activity in 2014 was, for the most part, the continuation of the work of the preceding academic year. As was the case since 2010 as well, my research was chiefly concentrated on three interconnected areas: 1. Theories of language and language acquisition, 2. Semantics and language philosophy and 3. Social semiotics.</p> <p>In connection with my ongoing research I presented a paper entitled “Foretokens and Vestiges of Protracted Social Conflict Situations in the Early 20th Century Turkish Literature” on The 4th Asian Literature and Librarianship between 3rd – 6th April 2014 in Osaka / Japan.</p> <p>My second oral presentation was entitled “Meditations on the Ramifications of Deleuzian Thought on Theories of Linguistics and Semiotics” read on the 2nd International Deleuze Studies in Asia Conference that took place between 6-8 June 2014 in Osaka / Japan.</p> <p>I presented another paper entitled “Qizilbash in Contemporary Turkey and the Music of Qizilbash” (Original Title: “現代トルコにおけるクズルバシユとクズルバシユの音楽”) at the annual Symposium of the Alevi/Bektashi Research Group at the Osaka International University on 2nd August 2014 in Osaka.</p> <p>Short thereafter I presented another paper entitled “On the Reception of Macro-Altaic Theory in Japanese and Turkish Studies: A Science-Critical Survey” on Permanent International Altaistic Conference, 57nd Annual Meeting of the PIAC organized by the Far Eastern Branch of Russian Academy of Sciences Institute of History between 9-14 September 2014 in Vladivostok / Russia.</p> <p>A paper entitled “On Technology-Supported Education – Paradigm Shift in Language Teaching –” was published in In Cybermedia Forum, No. 15. ISSN – 1345–9066. Cybermedia Center, Osaka University. Osaka, September 2014.</p> <p>I organized an international symposium “Language and the Human Condition: Social Conflict and Linguistic Behaviour – The European Treatment of ‘Kurds’” – within the framework of the research project „Language and Social Conflict: Conflict Reading” at Osaka University on November 2nd 2014.</p> <p>On the above mentioned international symposium I presented a paper entitled “Social Conflict and Linguistic Behaviour: A Re-reading of the Narrative of the Babel Tower” (Original Title: Sozialer Konflikt und Sprachverhalten: Eine Neulektüre der Erzählung vom Turmbau zu Babel).</p> <p>As partial result of my three-year research project “Social Conflict and Linguistic Behaviour: ‘Conflict Reading’” I edited and published the following book: Language and the Human Condition: Speech Act and Multilingualism in Conflict Societies. (Original Title: “Sprache und Conditio Humana: Sprachhandlung und Mehrsprachigkeit in Konfliktgesellschaften” (Hrsg.) / “言語と人間性—コンフリクト社会に見る言語行為と多言語” (編)). Bilingual Edition (German and Japanese).
