1. FIELDS OF RESEARCH AND NUMBER OF APPLICANTS TO BE ACCEPTED

- (1) Fields of research: Japanese language, culture or a closely related field
- (2) Number of applicants to be accepted: up to several

2. QUALIFICATIONS

- (1) Nationality: Applicants must be foreign nationals (with the exception of permanent residents).
- (2) Academic background eligibility requirement: Only those applicants from the following categories are eligible to apply:
 - ① Applicants who have either completed or will have completed a sixteen-year course of primary and secondary education by September 30, 2025.
 - ② Applicants who have graduated from a university in Japan or expect to graduate by September 30,2025.
 - ③ Applicants who have obtained or are expected to obtain by September 30, 2025 a degree equivalent to a Bachelor's degree by completing coursework for a period of at least three years at a foreign university or a foreign educational institution.
 - ④ Applicants recognized by the Graduate School of Language and Culture, The University of Osaka to have a level of academic competence equivalent to or superior that of graduates from Japanese universities and are at least twenty-two years of age as of September 30, 2025.
- (3) Recommendation: Applicants must be recommended by their affiliated university or institution or an advisor or equivalent belonging to their affiliated university or institution.
- (4) Health: Applicants must be free from any mental or physical condition that might interfere with their studies.
- (5) Language: Applicants must be proficient in either English or Japanese.
- (6) Registration: Applicants must be able to complete the entrance procedure by the appointed date.
- * Admission will be cancelled if students fail to graduate from their university by September 30, 2025.

3. SCHOOL FEE

- (1) Enrollment Fee: 282,000 yen
- (2) Tuition Fee: 535,800 yen (First semester: 267,900 yen, Second semester: 267,900 yen)
- * The amounts described above are valid for the academic year of 2024 In the case these fees are revised, at the time of entrance or during enrollment, the newly revised fees are to be applied from the date of revision.
- * Those who are enrolled into the double-degree program and Japanese Government Scholarship Student are exempted from paying the enrollment fee and the tuition fee.

4. SELECTION AND NOTIFICATION OF ACCEPTANCE

- Selection will be made on the basis of the submitted documents and an in-person interview (or interview by phone, internet, or email Q&A). The interview is scheduled to be held in <u>mid-June.2025</u>.
- (2) Notification of acceptance / denial of admission will be sent out to applicants by mail or email on <u>July</u> <u>11</u>.

5. APPLICATION PROCEDURE

Applicants must submit the following documents to the address specified in Section 10 during the application period.

From April 7, 2025 (Mon) to May 9, 2025 (Fri) (Must arrive by the deadline).

•For documents (1) and (3) among the application documents, download the designated format from the Osaka University website and create them.

·For documents in languages other than Japanese and English, <u>be sure to attach a translation in</u> Japanese.

·Attach the designated cover page when submitting the application documents.

• If the application documents are not completely and accurately filled out, incomplete, or arrive after the submission deadline, they will not be accepted. Additionally, the application documents will not be returned.

- (NB 1) In special circumstances where it is not possible to obtain the original copy of the recommendation letter, it is permissible to submit an electronic file with the recommender's handwritten signature. However, please be aware that we may contact the recommender to verify the authenticity of the document.
- (NB 2) For items (7) and (8), if you are unable to submit the original documents, please provide certified copies that have been accurately replicated from the originals. These copies should be verified by your previous educational institution, embassy, notary public, or another official public institution.
- (NB 3) Those who are research students of The University of Osaka's Graduate School of Language and Culture, Studies in Language and Society or Studies in Japanese Language and Culture program at the time of application are exempted from submitting items (6), (7) and (10).

(NB 4) Applicants for the double-degree program are exempted from paying the application fee and submitting items (2), (3), (8), (9) and (10).

6. UOsaka Humanities Outstanding International Student Award

[For Applicants Planning to Enroll as Self-Financed International Students Only]

To enhance research capabilities and increase the intake of international students, the Graduate School of Letters has established the "UOsaka Humanities Outstanding International Student Award" for self-financed international students recognized as outstanding in the graduate school entrance examination.

Those selected as "UOsaka Humanities Outstanding International Students" will be eligible for the "UOsaka Humanities Outstanding International Student Award (officially known as The University of Osaka Tuition Exemption System for Outstanding Self-Financed International Students)," which grants a full exemption from tuition fees throughout the enrollment period (limited to the standard 3-year duration of the doctoral program).

The selection for the "Applied Japanese Studies Course in the Doctoral Program" is an entrance examination specifically designated for " UOsaka Humanities Outstanding International Students." Those who wish to benefit from this system must pass this examination. Applicants recognized as outstanding self-financed international students deserving of the award will be admitted within the allocated quota, and the award's tuition exemption will be applied.

In addition, the Graduate School of Letters expects " UOsaka Humanities Outstanding International Students" to play a leadership role in research and plans to implement initiatives centered around these outstanding students.

Applicants wishing to apply for this system should refer to the attached document "Regarding the Tuition Exemption System for Outstanding Self-Financed International Students," confirm their eligibility, and check the designated box in the application form.

7. Security Export Control

At our university, based on the "Foreign Exchange and Foreign Trade Act," we have established the "The University of Osaka Security Export Control Regulations" and conduct strict reviews on the export of goods and the provision of technology (including the acceptance of individuals). Please be aware that if the regulations apply, even if you pass the entrance examination, you may not be allowed to enroll, or there may be restrictions such as not being able to receive the desired education or conduct research. 8. Handling of Personal Information

(1) The personal information such as name, address, and other details submitted at the time of application will be used for entrance examination operations such as "selection of entrants (application processing, conducting selection tests)," "announcement of successful candidates," and "enrollment procedures." Additionally, information about successful candidates may be used after the announcement of results to guide them about educational programs available after enrollment. For enrolled students,

personal information will also be used for "academic affairs (student registration management, academic guidance)," "student support (health management, tuition fee exemption and scholarship applications, career support, etc.)," and "tuition fee collection operations."

(2) Personal information such as examination scores used for the selection of entrants will be utilized for the aggregation and analysis of entrance examination results and for the investigation and research of selection methods.

(3) Personal information obtained in (1) and (2) may also be used for "improvement of selection methods and university education" and "university management and operations (various surveys and analyses, project planning, etc.)." However, the results will not be published in a way that identifies individuals.

(4) In conducting the above operations and enrollment procedures, some operations may be outsourced to external contractors. In such cases, a contract will be made with the external contractor to ensure the appropriate handling of personal information, and the contractor will be provided with all or part of the personal information submitted.

Accepted students are advised to study the Japanese language and have some general knowledge of the Japanese climate, customs, manners and university education and conditions before coming to Japan.
